Here we are already at the end of the half term! Next half term will be a very busy one. Please see the diary dates below, so you know exactly when events are happening.

Road Safety

Unfortunately, another one of our pupils has been involved in an accident, he was hit by a car running across the road. This has been the fourth child in the past 18 months that has been hit by a car. The accident happened while the child was with their parents. The school will respond by reminding children of the road safety rules. We are also asking you at this time, to hold your child's hand when crossing the road especially during the half term break.

Phonic Checks and SATS

Currently, many children and families across the country are talking about SATS. For infant children, the SATS tests are no longer statutory. So, schools can decide that Year 2 do not have to take these tests. There is no requirement for the results of the tests to be sent to the local authority or the DfE. However, this year Elmwood Infants has chosen to do the tests, but under more relaxed conditions. The tests will only form part of our end of year assessment information for our Year 2 pupils. Teacher assessment has always been viewed as more valuable than testing as it gives a more rounded assessment of your children as learners. The Phonic Checks for Year 1 and some Year 2 children is still statutory and will take place in June. To support you children to do their best, your teachers might be giving you additional phonics homework to do ahead of the tests or to invite you in for a meeting to give you more information on the phonic check.

Attendance Update

Our school attendance has been affected by a spate of chickenpox which has spread across the school recently.

Catching infectious diseases is part of early childhood for most of us unfortunately. The NHS advice is if you see a pox appear on your child's face or body and they present with a fever or flu-like symptoms, it is likely to be chickenpox. If this is the case, then please keep your child at home until all the pox marks have dried and have scabbed over. This is an indication that your child is no longer infectious.
